

**RESOLUTION 2005  
TOWN OF ROUND HILL  
CURTAILING TRUCK TRAFFIC**

**Whereas** one of the primary duties of the Round Hill Town Council is to serve its citizens and protect their safety and property; and,

**Whereas** the Town of Round Hill is experiencing high volume of commercial and construction-related trucks on Main Street (Route 719) going to and from construction sites located north of town; and,

**Whereas** these vehicles often travel at excessive speeds on a narrow two-lane road originally built when people traveled by horse and buggy; and,

**Whereas** there have been several incidents of these trucks sideswiping cars parked along Main Street and failing to stop to assess damages or to report the damages to the vehicles' owners; and,

**Whereas** Evening Star Drive, on the east edge of Round Hill, has been designed as a circumferential road to meet current VDOT standards for a two-lane road; and,

**Whereas** Evening Star Drive is readily accessible to the Route 7 bypass for traffic coming from the east or west of Round Hill;

**Therefore**, be it resolved that the Round Hill Town Council requests the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors take all necessary actions to request the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) ban all through commercial and construction trucks on Main Street (Route 719) between its intersections with Loudoun Street and Greenwood Commons.
